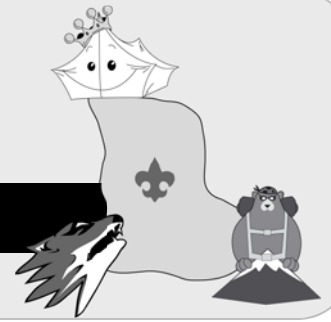

Family Fishing Weekend - June 6-7

Come for the day Saturday or Sunday or join us for the whole weekend. Bring your own gear or borrow some of ours. There is plenty of opportunities to fish from shore and those with a current swim test can use our canoes, rowboats and paddleboats.

This event is in conjunction with the Wisconsin DNR's Free Fishing Weekend. Residents & nonresidents of all ages can fish without a license over these two days.

Saturday lunch, Saturday dinner and Sunday breakfast will be available for \$4 per meal.

Families are welcome to stay overnight Saturday and use cabin and campsite space. Use of campsites is free and will be on a first come first served basis. Cabins/rooms can be rented at a nominal fee of \$2 per bed.

Webelos Fall Adventure - September 24-26

From the moment that your son and his fellow Webelos arrive at Tesomas on Saturday morning till they depart Sunday afternoon, he will be immersed in a program based solely around the Webelos experience. Campers will experience what awaits them in Boy Scouting. This event takes place September 24-26 and is open to Scouts registered as a Webelos in the fall of 2010 and their parents. Fall Cub Camp - October 2, 3, 9, or 10

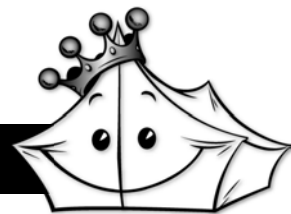

Campers will see if their tribe (patrol) has what it takes to survive and earn immunity. In addition, Thursday evening will feature "Smiley's Birthday Bash" as we celebrate Tesomas's 75th anniversary and 100 years of Scouting.

Check-In

Those Units with Scouts attending our week long high adventure treks should check in at 1:00 pm. All other Units should arrive ready to check in at 2:00 pm. Your campsite host for the week, will meet your Unit in the parking lot. Remember if your unit plans to arrive early, someone must call at least two weeks in advance to get approval. For the quickest check-in please have all medical forms in alphabetic order separated by those who take medication and those who do not.

Medical Forms

An annual medical evaluation by a certified and licensed healthcare provider is required for all campers. Parts A, B & C are to be completed annually and signed by a licensed physician. Campers staying less than 72 consecutive hours can omit part B. **Medical forms may be sent to camp 2 weeks in advance to speed up check-in. Anyone staying at camp overnight must turn in a form.**

Micro-Trek

Micro-Treks are filling up, however, there are several weeks with space available. If your Scouts are looking for adventure this summer, encourage them to try micro-trek. Activities include COPE, Mountain Biking, Disc Golf, Canoeing and Horseback Riding. Reservations can be made online or through the Scout office.

Signing Up for Advancement

We encourage Leaders to sign Scouts up for advancement opportunities online. For complete instructions, refer to the "Registration Help File" available on our website or in the Guidebook. Bluecards can be turned in Sunday to the advancement mailboxes.

Notes and Reminders

Tuesday Night Packout – Units will fill out the order form at the Sunday's leaders meeting. Meal choices can be found on the camp menu available online. In a conservation effort, camp no longer provides disposable plates, cups, and eating utensils, so plan accordingly.

Program Supplement – To help you and your Scouts plan for specific programs and activities two copies will be provided to each unit at camp upon arrival.

Troop Photos - Any Unit who would like to participate will receive a complimentary 8x10 photograph. Parents, Leaders, and Scouts can order additional photos using the form found online. Photos will be ready at check out.

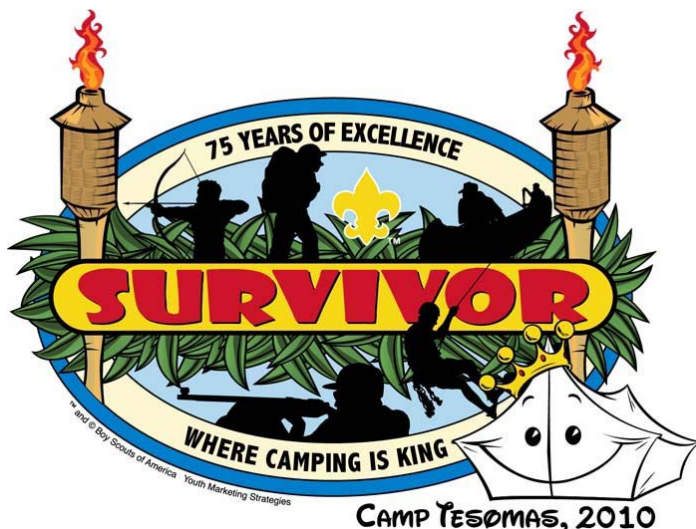

Medical Forms

2 and 3 Day Sessions - All campers attending the 2 or 3 day sessions must complete parts A and C of the Annual Health and Medical Form including a parents signature. A doctor's physical is not required. The form is available on our website.

4 Day Sessions - All campers attending 4 day sessions must complete Parts A, B and C of the Annual Health and Medical Form. A current doctor's physical is required. The form is available online.



Camp balances are due June 1st. Payments can be made online or through the Scout Center.

Advancement

During each camp session, there will be opportunities for advancement. Scouts can choose from a variety of advancements. Staff members will lead Scouts in learning with a twist of fun.

Notes and Reminders

Custom T-Shirts – Pre-order custom T-shirts online for everyone in your unit to wear at camp. Shirts cost \$12 (additional charges for larger sizes) and can be customized with your unit number or other text. T-shirts must be paid for at time of purchase with a credit card or electronic check. **Pre-orders are due May 26.**

Check-In - All packs should arrive ready to check in between 1:00 and 1:30 p.m. A staff member will guide you in the parking lot and guide you through the check-in process. For the quickest check-in please have all medical forms in alphabetic order separated by those who take medication and those who do not.

Dietary Needs – Please notify us of any special dietary needs or restrictions two weeks before your arrival using the form available online.

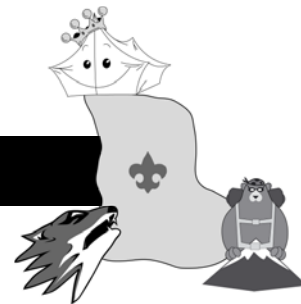

Reservations for 2011 adventures are now open. You can reserve space for your Den, Pack, Troop or Crew.

Polar Cubs



Polar Cubs is a unique winter program for Cub Scouts and their families. Campers are grouped into "Super Dens" keeping those from the same Pack together. Super Dens rotate through various activities led by staff members. The

program focuses on outdoor winter adventure.

Registration includes a bunk in one of our many heated cabins, indoor showers and restrooms as well as two or three meals prepared for you. Between meals campers will have the opportunity to go snowshoeing, sledding, play broomball and much more.

Polar Cubs runs four alternating weekends in January and February with most of the activities on Saturday. Campers have the option of a Friday night or Saturday night stay.



Registration for winter camp will open September 1st. Units can reserve space with a \$5 per person deposit.

Hanna Winter Resort

Hanna Winter Resort aims to provide everything Boy Scouts and Venturers need to have an incredible outdoor winter experience. Enjoy the pristine winter northwoods environment around the Base and the freedom to do nearly any winter activity you want whenever you want.

Registration includes a bunk in one of our many heated cabins, indoor showers and restrooms as well as four meals prepared for you. Between meals campers can use our snowshoes, bushwacker skis, broomball equipment, ice fishing gear, and use the indoor climbing wall. You can also arrange to build a snow shelter and sleep in it over night.
