

Erv Romansky Family Campground

Reservation Procedures & Fees:

- Reservations can be made up to a year in advance by contacting the Wausau Homes Scout Center at 715-355-1450 or 800-303-2195. Payment can be made up to 2 weeks in advance at the Weston office (3511 Camp Phillips Road) or at camp upon arrival.
- Sites are \$15 per night.
- All sites include electric and water.

Check In & Out Procedures

- All campers must register at the Tesomas Program Center when they arrive at the campground. If the office is not open please stop back the next day to pick up your permit and check-in.
- Campsite Check-in begins at 2:00 PM and checkout should be done by 10:00 AM at the Tesomas Program center.
- You may set up earlier if the site was not occupied the night before. If you are unable to leave by 10 am, contact the reservation office at Tesomas.

Rules & Regulations

Camping Party:

A site may not be occupied by more than a “non-family group” of six persons or a “family” of parent(s) with their dependent children and not more than 2 guests.

Fires & Firewood:

Fires are allowed in fire rings and grills only. Do not leave fires unattended, and put out all fires before leaving. Do not burn garbage, plastic, glass, cans or other recyclable items.

Campers are prohibited from bringing firewood onto our property because it can harbor many different kinds of invasive pests and diseases harmful to our trees. Pests like gypsy moth and diseases like oak wilt are easily spread through infested firewood. Wisconsin is now faced with the very real threat of becoming the next state to discover the emerald ash borer within its borders. Campers can gather downed wood or purchase firewood from our trading post.

Hours:

The campground is closed to non-campers between 10 pm and 7:30 am. All visitors must leave the park by 10 pm. During closed hours, campers must be in or be enroute to their registered campsite. No camping party may set up or take down a camping unit between the 10 pm and 7:30 am. Our camps (Tesomas, Akela’s World & Hanna Venture Base) are also closed to all visitors (including those staying in family camping) between these hours.

Noise:

At no time may the noise on a campsite create a disturbance or interfere in any manner with other people's enjoyment of the campground.

Recycling and Refuse:

Plan your camping to produce as little trash as possible. Campsites and picnic areas, do not have trash cans. However, there are some dumpsters in the campgrounds for your use if necessary. Bins are also available for recyclable items of glass, plastic and aluminum.

Showers:

Showers are available at the Hanna Shower House. These can be accessed by following the trail directly across from the main entrance to the campground.

Swimming & Boating:

Campers are allowed to swim at their own risk at the Family Camping beach located off of Hanna lane. Campers are allowed to use their own kayaks or rowboats on the lake provided everyone is wearing a lifejacket. For more information

Switching Sites:

Campers may not switch sites without prior approval.

Vehicles:

Motor vehicles are restricted to the designated parking area on each campsite. No more than two motor vehicles (except as many as six motorcycles) are allowed per campsite.

Visiting our Camps:

All visitors must check in and out at the camp office. Visitors are not allowed between the hours of 10:00 pm and 7:30 am. On Wednesday our Open House begins at 3:30 pm with a picnic style meal served at 6:00 pm. The highlight of the evening, the Order of the Arrow Calling Out Ceremony begins at 8:00 pm. Visitors should not bring pets into our camps. Guest meal tickets may be purchased for \$5 per meal in the Program Center.

Note: If you or any member or guest of your camping party violate any state law or the rules above, you may be evicted from the park, have your camping permit revoked, and lose any fees you have paid.
