Planning & Preparation:

First Aid

Although we all try to avoid any possibility of injury, we are dealing with boys, who, more often than not, tend to be just that. First aid staff will be on site for any accidents and injuries.

Fires

All fires must be in fire pits only! No fire is to be left alone. All fires are to be extinguished before retiring to bed and before leaving camp. Please observe no flames in tent. There is water in each campsite for putting the fire out.

Meals

All meals will be provided in the dining hall except lunch on Saturday. For this meal, you will prepare foil packets at the prep area and cook them on your campfire in your campsite. The foil cooking is best when cooked on a charcoal fire. You will need approx. 10 lbs of charcoal for the typical den of 10 people. **Participants are expected to bring their own mess kit.**

Medical Forms

Every participant must provide a copy of their annual health and medical form to be kept on file after they leave. Please complete parts A & B; a doctors signature is not required for this event.

Weather

This is a fall event, your plans should take into consideration the weather we can have during this time of year; it can be warm and sunny, or it can be cool and rainy, or both. Make sure you have appropriate clothing and bedding.

Check-In & Out

Check-In

Check-In will begin at 7:00 PM Friday evening. Participants should arrive as a unit and use the Tesomas entrance. Upon checking in you will be asked to present a roster of those in attendance and turn in health histories. Any unpaid balances will also be collected at this time.

Once you have unloaded your equipment please return vehicles to the main Parking Lot. **All vehicles must be parked in this lot and remain there until Sunday.**

Check-Out will begin after the activities Sunday morning. You are not to leave camp until your site has been inspected by a staff member to make sure it is clean.
